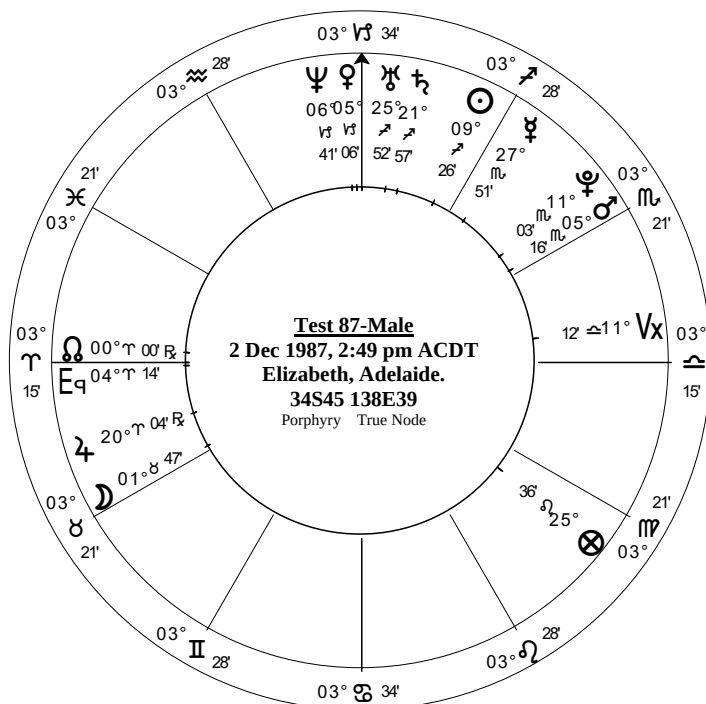


TEST NO. 87 REPORT

Test No. 87 was an exercise to discover which of five events was the one that actually occurred in the life of a schoolboy born **18 December 2003** at 2:49 pm ACDT in Adelaide, South Australia (34S45, 138E39).

He was living at Hervey Bay (25S18, 152E54) at the time of the event.



The five events (four are fictional) are the following:

1. He quarrelled with a school friend.
2. He failed an examination.
3. He was in trouble for truancy.
4. He broke his wrist in play.
5. His mother became ill.

The answer is No. 4, **he broke his wrist in play**.

Age Harmonic 16 gives an immediate unequivocal answer. Mars conjunct Mercury in the House of Illness, both planets square to Pluto and Uranus, clearly signifies the accident to the wrists. Important in reading Harmonic Charts is to look for the very close Aspects (orb about 1°) and especially conjunctions. The only other close Aspect in this Chart is Venus trine Jupiter, which obviously has no relation to any of the other four “events”.

The next best Chart is the **precessed Lunar Return** (relocated). Mars is conjunct the Equatorial Asc square Pluto (and also natal Saturn and Uranus).

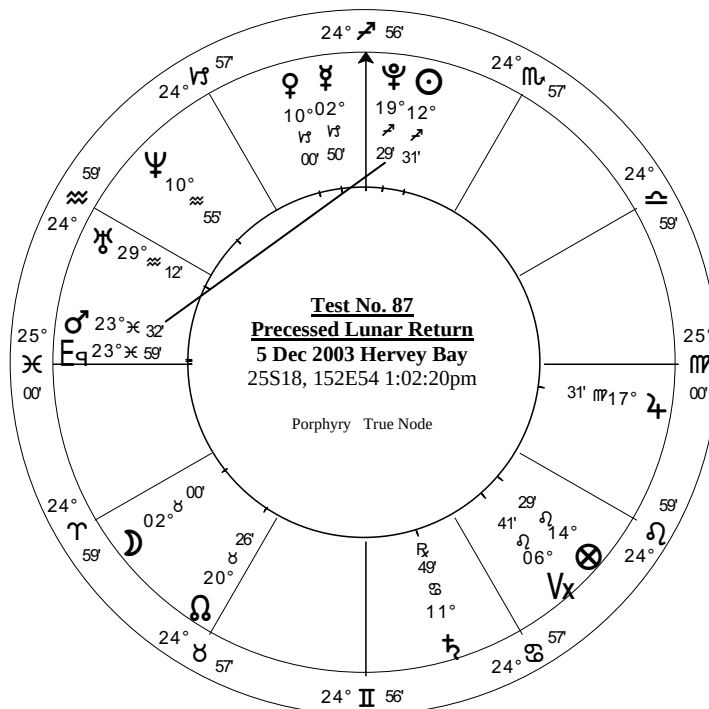
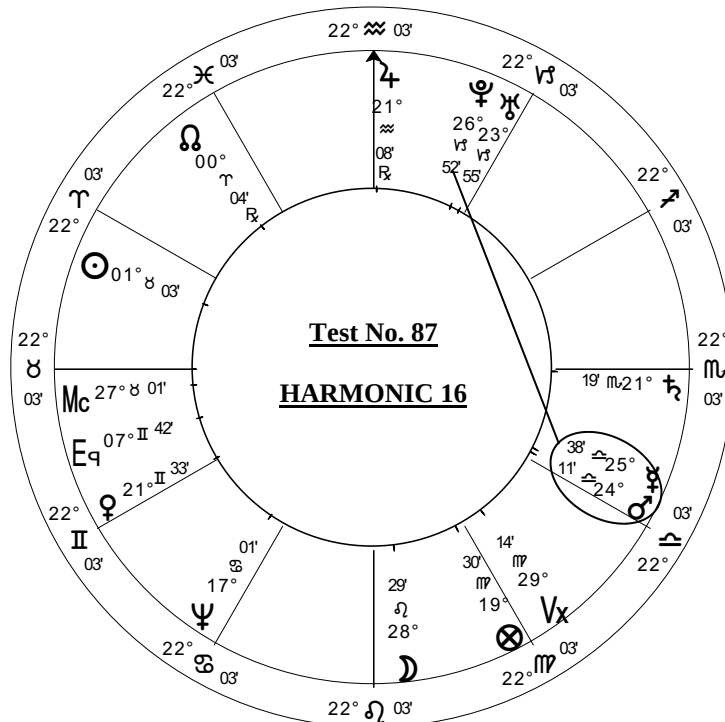
There were 31 respondents to the Test and ten found the solution at the first attempt. Here is a summary of their answers giving the method and the most important factor in it:

Mercury Return Chart: ♄ 13Cn00, ♂ ♃ / ♃ 13Cp22.

Progressed Mercury conjunct Saturn.

Sidereal Lunar Return: Saturn on (Porphyry) Cusp 5 in Gemini (wrist).

— Mutombo (Czechoslovakia).

T. ♄ at 10 Cancer quincunxes ♀ (exact).

— Nancy McEwen (USA).

Vedic : The boy is running ♀-♄-♄, ♂ transiting Asc which is in Saturn's star.

— Wasistas (Germany).

Precessed Lunar Return, as above.

— Ross Harvey (Australia).
