

## TEST NO. 100—REPORT

Test 100 concerned a woman born in Sydney Australia on 16 Oct 1956. Here is her Birth Horoscope.



The Test was to find what occurred in her life on 7 July 2004. The answer is **her mother died**.

This Test proved unexpectedly difficult. Only three answers from the 25 recipients could be counted as correct. Two of the three decided that the father died. I accepted this as a correct answer because it was sufficient to say that a parent died.

One respondent, Michel Deloore (France), the very first one in, got it exactly right. She wrote:

*By using the Indian periods, I observe that it's the period of Mercury, sub-period of Kethu and inter-period of Sun. In the Natal Chart, Sun is in the 4th House in Libra, in "fall" (chute); this is the House of the mother. Kethu is in the 11th House, which is the 8th of the 4th: Neptune symbolizes loss. The conjunction of the Sun and Neptune in the 4th House (Terminations) is the meaning driven home by Saturn's sextile to conjunction in the 12th House with the Sun. Pluto (death) and sesquare to Venus (female). Saturn is the master of the 8th House: Aquarius: mulatrikona. Probably the death of*

*her mother was combined with an inheritance.*

The other two answers accepted as correct came from Fenneke Monchen and Christine Kaspers both of whom used Vedic Astrology:

*The woman was in a Me-Ke-Ju dasa. Me is conjunct the Sun = father = lord of the 12th = loss of. Ke = detachment, in 9 = father. Ke is in Taurus, Dispositor is Venus and stands in this Horoscope for the father too. And Ve is in the 12th of loss. —Fenneke Monchen (Holland).*

*The woman had a Mercury, Ketu, Jupiter Dasa and all three have to do with the 9th House (father) and the 12th (loss). Besides Jupiter is lord of the 8th from the 9th, death of father.*



the closest planetary connection in the Chart: **Saturn conjunct Neptune** (orb 0°31'). Saturn rules the 10th House (the mother), and the 11th House, which is the 8th of the 4th: Neptune symbolizes loss. The conjunction of the Sun and Neptune in the 4th House (Terminations) is the meaning driven home by Saturn's sextile to conjunction in the 12th House with the Sun. Pluto (death) and sesquare to Venus (female).



The closest planetary connection here is the **Moon conjunct Uranus** in Pisces. Uranus symbolizes shock and the Moon symbolizes the mother and rules the 8th House (*death*). In the 8th House Mars (*injury, death*) conjuncts Mercury, ruling the 10th House (*the mother*) and the 6th (*illness*).

From a perusal of the replies sent in to the Test it is apparent that some participants are searching for an extraordinary, strange or remarkable event. It is not my intention to set Tests requiring this sort of answer.

The object of the Tests is to give practice in divining the common and ordinary occurrences of life, those that make up the huge bulk of the events in most people's lives. Things remarkable and extraordinary are comparatively rare. It is good to be able to read from a Chart what common-place event it is portraying, and this is the skill mostly required.

So remember, I am not out to trick you! Look for what is typical in ordinary life having relation to the age and circumstances of the subject.
